

Khouria Frederica Mathewes-Green is an American author and speaker, primarily known for her work on Eastern Orthodox Christianity. She earned a Master of Theological Studies (MTS) degree from Virginia Theological Seminary. She and her family converted to Orthodoxy from the Episcopal Church in 1993. She is married to Rev. Fr. Gregory Mathewes-Green.

Rev. Fr. Stephen Mathewes is the Parish Priest of Christ the Savior Greek Orthodox Church in Bluff City, Tennessee, and son of Rev. Fr. Gregory and Kh. Frederica Mathewes-Green. He earned his B.A. in Musicology, and worked as a piano tuner, before enrolling as a seminarian at Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology where he completed a Master of Divinity degree.

Spyridoula Fotinis, serves as the Director of Inter-Parish Associations for the Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of the USA. Previously, she worked as the Programs Coordinator for the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, focusing on social issues at the United Nations, including homelessness, mental health, human trafficking, and environmental care.

Alexei Krindatch, is a sociologist of religion specializing in Orthodox Christianity in the United States. He graduated from Moscow State University, majoring in human and economic geography, and later pursued postgraduate studies at the Institute of Geography of the Russian Academy of Sciences, focusing on the geography of religions. He also completed a program on Religion, Human Rights, and Religious Freedom at Columbia University in New York.
